Irvine was responsible for the printing of a number of Ioway/ English primers, educational and religious books to enhance literacy for the Ioway students, as well as for their conversion to Christianity.

The original diary has been microfilmed [Microfilm: MS 89]. A typed version of the hand written diary (not on microfilm) is a part of the collection (pp165).
